Waiting for the King

We wait.

We wait in line. We wait for the next payday. For the test results to hit the portal. For repairs to be completed. For the three blinking dots to manifest a text.

Sometimes there are entire seasons of waiting, times when God seems quiet. We wait—and hope—for good things to happen. For God’s intervention. To see God answer our prayers and move in our lives.

Not all waiting is bad. As the body of Christ, we wait for our Savior. Advent is here, and so we are called to a beautiful season of anticipating the arrival of Jesus.

Our sermon series for the next five weeks is inspired by our own season of waiting here at King Street Church.



Pastor Becky Hann noticed that the upcoming children’s curriculum is all about being reminded of God’s great faithfulness, and there is nothing more important in a time of waiting than knowing you can trust the One in control.



The WonderInk material says, “This series is an invitation to witness God’s faithfulness to His people— to us! For hundreds of years, God’s people waited for God to act, to make good on His promises, to send an everlasting King to make all things right. And God was at work the whole time, even when Israel was carried off to exile, and even when the people returned home to a land ruled by foreign powers. God prepared the way for Jesus, working through unlikely people in humble places. Then, when the waiting was finally over, God invited people to meet Jesus and worship Him.”

That same invitation is extended to us today.

Pastor Becky says, “In this season of waiting — and we are all waiting for different things— we must focus in on the promise that God gave us for the baby Jesus to come. In the Bible, we see so many people waiting for the promised Messiah, and He came as a baby in a manger. Now we live in the hope that our Messiah will return, and the promise

will be completely fulfilled. It’s in the waiting that we have our hope and put our trust in Him.”

She continues, “As we continue to look for what God has for King Street Church, we can rely on the promise that we have in Jesus.”

Pastor Steve Flint says that Advent and Lent are two of his favorite times of year. “When Advent starts, it’s the beginning of a brand new year for me in my life with Jesus,” he says. “I ask myself, what does God want me to do differently in my life so that I am ready to receive Him?”

As Pastor Steve reflects on what it means to wait, he says, “Every single time of waiting — and I think of many times God’s people have waited in horrible situations, times of pain and persecution, times when they cried out to God for help — those times were also highly transformative. This is what I look forward to, the transformation. Yes, we *could* become bitter and miserable during seasons of waiting but we are given the opportunity to be changed into Christ’s likeness. We are invited to be molded into someone appropriate to meet the King of Kings, to become holy and disciplined and deeply in love with Jesus. God can do a brand new work in us, and I’m ready for that.”

Pastor Becky adds that our staff is always looking for opportunities to engage in intergenerational experiences. This December, we will study the same material as our children. The kids will learn these truths in Sunday School while the adults are hearing them from our pastors.

A great benefit is that our parents can discuss the lessons each Sunday with their children.

“Jesus is worthy to be worshipped,” Pastor Becky reminds us. “We worship that King today and we wait for Him.”

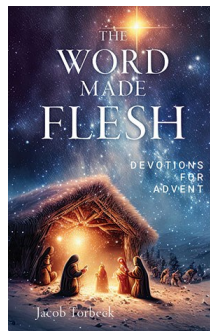

Join us for The Bible Recap in 2025!

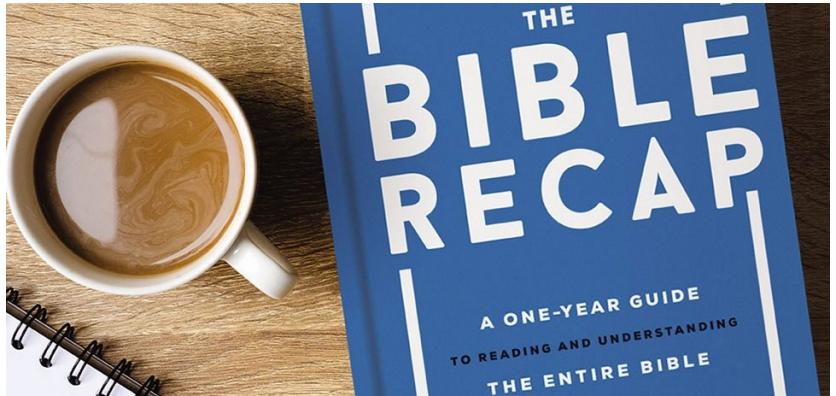
One of our cherished traditions here at King Street is to read the Bible together each year, following the same plan. We are excited about the Bible Reading Plan for 2025. We will revisit the Chronological Reading Plan, supplemented by enlightening videos provided by “The Bible Recap.”

Some of our staff have used these materials and find them to be a valuable resource.

On their website at thebible Recap.com, the question is posed: *Have you ever closed your Bible and thought, “What did I just read?” Maybe you’ve tried to read through the Bible but quit when it felt confusing or impersonal?*

The Bible Recap follows a chronological Bible reading plan and has a short daily recap by creator and host, Tara-Leigh Cobble. She’ll highlight and summarize that day’s Bible reading in a casual, easy to understand way.

If you have never participated in the plan, we encourage you to join the more than 400 people who use these readings as part of their daily devotions. The plan is offered several ways. Those who are already signed up will be included in the new plan.

God at Work

THROUGH KSC LEADERSHIP

September Highlights

The Board of Administration of King Street Church met on Monday, September 16, 2024, in the Fellowship Room. Brad Etchberger, Chairman of the Board of Administration, called the meeting to order.

EXECUTIVE PASTOR REPORT

Pastor Steve Flint thanked the pastors for preaching on Sunday mornings while we continue the process of hiring a new Senior Pastor. He reported the Ministry Fair had a few people sign up to serve and a Newcomers Luncheon will be held soon. On September 28, Susanna Allen will be celebrating 15 years on-staff here at KSC. Pastor Steve asked for prayer regarding the new fall ministry activities.

ELDER REPORT

Greg West reported the elders met and prayerfully considered ways to work with and support young men, couples and families in the congregation.

COMMISSION REPORTS *(alpha order)*

Adult Ministries – Pastor Jay Brown reviewed various ministries available for adults here at KSC including: Tuesday/Wednesday night women’s classes, coed Tuesday night Bible Study, Wednesday night Band of Brothers, Thursday night women’s Prayer & Fellowship, L3 groups (*approximately 30*), 15 adult Sunday School classes and The Porch young adult group.

Children’s Ministry – Pastor Becky Hann shared the Children’s Ministry will be part of Downtown Chambersburg’s Trick or Treat event on October 26. The Fall Carnival will be held on October 30. Tutors are needed for the After School Program. Becky added that she and the other pastors are working together to provide pastoral care to the congregation since Ron Cook’s retirement.

Finance – Ken Adams shared the Finance Commission will be meeting on Monday, September 30. Dan Gehris reported on August 2024 and 2024 YTD financial results, and the status of commission member vacancies for 2025.

Local Outreach – Sharon Bowers reported the LOC met and prayed for the ministry partners that KSC supports.

Missions – Don MacAskill shared that Pastor Jay Brown and Andy Paszkowski gave the Mission Commission a report regarding the trip to Thailand. The Mission Commission approved some financial gifts to our mission partners.

Property – John Little reported on the Narthex Project and thanked the Board for their support for this project. John shared that an application of UV window protection to the Sanctuary windows would help UV damage to the pews in the future. John also shared that Baker Center Rooftop HVAC Unit #4 will need to be replaced.

Student Ministry – Nathan Rosenberger reported the school year kickoff went very well; 98 high school students and 70 middle school students attended. Pastor Rob Gunkelman reported there will be a student trip to Greece in June 2025, and a staff in-service occurring in the near future. All-Church Worship will be held on October 3.

Worship Arts – Quentin Clapper shared more volunteers are needed in the area of Worship Arts.

October Highlights

The Board of Administration of King Street Church met on Monday, October 21, 2024. Brad Etchberger, Chairman of the Board of Administration, called the meeting to order.

ELDER REPORT

Greg West reported that the elders are looking forward to mentoring and uplifting the families of KSC.

COMMISSION REPORTS

Adult Ministries – Bryan Bender thanked the pastors for their efforts and hard work while filling in on Sunday mornings with the sermon messages. Pastor Jay Brown recognized all those serving in Adult Ministry. Positive feedback was also shared about The Porch ministry.

Children's Ministry – Pastor Becky Hann shared that the Children's Ministry will be part of Downtown Chambersburg's Trick or Treat event on October 26. The Fall Carnival in the Baker Center will be

held on October 30. Parent's Night Out will be in November. A Night in Bethlehem will be held in December.

Finance – Dan Gehris reported on September 2024 and 2024 YTD financial results.

Local Outreach – Sharon Bowers reported the LOC met and prayed for the ministry partners that KSC supports.

Missions – Don MacAskill reported that beginning in January 2025, Alyssa Heberlig and Kaitlin Michael will be new members of the Missions Commission. Two missionaries will be visiting our church soon: Marena from Orphan's Tree and Willie from Rays of Hope in Malawi. Don shared information regarding the continued problems that our Haitian UB Churches are experiencing due to the violence in Haiti.

Property – Dan Adamson shared that the Property Commission is looking for two new members. Dan reported that the necessary corrections to the Narthex entrance stairs were completed. Dan also stated that the repairs to the Sanctuary pews and the UV window protection on the Sanctuary windows are now complete.

Student Ministry – Nathan Rosenberger reported that Pastor Rob just finished up a Wednesday night message series called, “Sound Tracks” which discussed common thoughts that young people have that hinder their walk with God.

Worship Arts – Carolyn Chenaille reported that the Student Night of Worship was a great success. The adult and children’s choirs are now active again. Bell Choir resumes on October 15. Tyler Roberts has a need for more techs for Thursday night rehearsals and camera people.

SENIOR PASTOR SEARCH UPDATE

On Tuesday, October 29, our Board of Administration considered the candidate which was under review for the position of Senior Pastor here at King Street Church. After much prayer, discussion, and careful consideration, the decision was made that he is not the right man for the role, and we will not proceed with hiring him.

On Sunday, November 3, Pastor Steve Flint announced during worship services that two new candidates are being considered for the senior pastor role. They have just been presented to us, and we will now begin our own thorough vetting process.

We appreciate your prayerful patience and commitment to King Street Church as we continue searching for our next senior pastor. It is a challenge to not become impatient and frustrated as we wait, but God’s people have a resilient nature. We trust in Christ and wait on God and His timing.

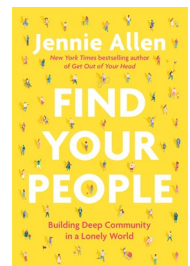
Adoption/Foster Group

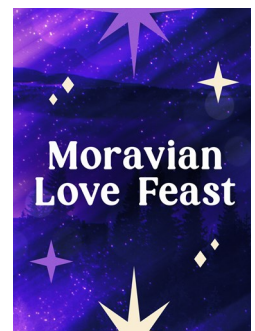

Update: Serve Saturday

On Saturday, November 3, 29 students worked on the properties of 10 church families as part of “Serve Saturday.” Serve Saturday *serves* multiple purposes. It is a way for the students to be the hands and feet of Christ. It gives us a tangible, visible way to further our King Street vision to engage and bless our community with the Gospel.



It teaches students to tithe not just with their money, but with their time and talents as well. It is always exciting to see the unexpected ways in which the students are gifted.

As we were cleaning the windows of a soon-to-be 92 year old widow, one of our students began talking with her about golf, and she shared how much she misses playing golfing. Then the student prayed for her. This had such a massive impact on the widow that she was still talking to me about it days later.

I think that my favorite thing about Serve Saturdays is how it breaks down generational barriers. I have found that the older generation doesn't feel like they will be able to relate to the younger one, just as the younger generation believes they won't be able to connect with their elders. However, once they start talking, both sides realize that while the world has changed, the stress and uncertainty of growing up hasn't. As conversations start, it is amazing to see how God unites hearts and breaks down barriers. It truly is the power of the Gospel at work!

A Faithful God

Over the last year our family has learned first hand how faithful God is. As we have dealt with Rigo leaving the family and big changes for each one of us, we can say we serve a faithful God. We have been surrounded by love, prayer, and friendships for each one of us. Anthony and Amanda have been welcomed into a great group of friends at the University they attend; as well they have the huge privilege of being closer to grandparents and aunts, uncle and nieces.

Adrian spends his free time with the maintenance crew at the hospital and they have welcomed him in as part of the gang. Adrian also has some great mentors who have poured into him. Abby and I are surrounded by friends and prayer partners and we know that many of you are praying for us.

We are always glad to have lots of people around who come to join the ministry. Each new person adds something special. God is faithful.

Legal Processes

One of the most challenging parts of my job is dealing with all of the legal processes that need to be handled in order to continue to run the hospital, make purchases in other countries, fulfill labor laws and bring in donations. Each of these situations is challenging as I learn what I need to do for the first time but it has been even more difficult as the government goes through

many changes. It has been like hitting a moving target. In the midst of all of this we have been able to learn, train and build important relationships so even in the middle of politics we are able to be reminded we serve a faithful God.

Women's Conference

I was able to travel with a group of 30 women from Balfate to a conference with 200 other women this past month. We spent 2 days in Bible study, games, worship, activities and prayer. Many lives were touched during this time. It was so encouraging to hear the testimonies of many women who are going through struggles but who have decided to let God take control of their situation. We all learned the importance of giving God our insecurities. I was able to share my testimony in the last session and it was such a good reminder of God's faithfulness.

A Legacy

I have been thinking a lot about legacy. We are enjoying time with my dad and listening to his stories and remembering great times we have had as we create new memories. As my dad's health quickly declines and he needs oxygen full time, we are thankful for the opportunity to spend time with him. To many, he has been the man who shared God's Word with them in their heart language. He wanted to communicate with everyone wherever he would go. So he would spend hours immersed in a new language just to make sure he could be understood by the new group of people he would visit.

Each one of us has a special relationship with Dad/Grandpa and he has been our advice giver, storyteller and shoulder to cry on. He has been a true example of service to the Lord. It will be hard to say goodbye when the time comes but we are so thankful for the legacy we have been

given and find peace knowing we serve the God of all Comfort.



Please pray for our family as we navigate a new chapter of Grandpa's life. Pray for good days to enjoy family time and strength and for each of us during this time. Please pray for my mom who is the caregiver and the one who remains strong through it all. She is surrounded by family and friends and God has been faithful in providing what is needed during this time. May we always remember God is faithful.

Sonia

When I arrived in Honduras 25 years ago one of the first people I met was Sonia. She was our first employee hired at the hospital. We became fast friends and have been through many things together. Sonia was a new Christian and we spent hours in discipleship.

Her two daughters are about the same age as my two daughters and they are also close friends. Sonia has gone from graduating from 6th grade while working as a maid to finishing nursing school and teachers college. She also owns her own business. In the early days she was always unsure of herself but now she has seen how God has brought her through the pain of losing a child and the triumphs of moving forward. Sonia is a living testimony that God is faithful.

Finding a Solution

The saying "You don't know what you have until it is gone," is true in many ways. For people who have had amputations it is extremely true. It is such a challenge to learn to live without a limb. One young patient who lost his leg in an accident decided not to give up. He actually crafted his own prosthetic leg in his dad's carpentry shop. It is so encouraging to watch people trust God to help them in the trials they are going through. What a good reminder of God's faithfulness in the midst of difficulties. On a recent visit from a prosthetist this young man was given even more encouragement and an even better prosthetic is being provided.

Many of the Christar workers in N ■ are in transition. Half of them will be moving to a new ministry location due to visa and residency needs. Pray that they will quickly settle and be able to continue with their gospel ministry.

Haiti Update

For over 10 years, KSC has partnered with the UB Church and school in Arcahaie. One of the ways we have supported this effort is by sponsoring children so that they can attend school.



November 6, 2024

Dear King Street Sponsor,

Here is the letter that we usually send along with your sponsored child's annual sponsorship report. With the current difficult situation in Haiti causing delays, we wanted to send you the most recent news from Arcahaie for your information and for your prayers. We are not confident at this point that we will be able to send annual progress reports for all children this year. At this point all the children are accounted for but many are moving to safe areas at least temporarily. As you will read, the situation is changing rapidly.

Thank you for your continued prayer and partnership together in Haiti. The partnership between the Haitian UB churches, North American UB churches and Karis Disability Services is helping sustain families and UB schools during these difficult times. Our local volunteers (mostly the UB pastors) are in the communities and checking in on families and offering school when it is safe to do so. We know from the news and from what has happened even to local UB



pastors in Haiti that life is dangerous there right now and we pray for God's protection as they continue to share God's love in their communities with your support.

Over the past year we have had 281 children sponsored. We have been supporting the schools in Arcahaie and Delmas and providing nutrition and Bible programs throughout the year. More than 200 children weekly receive nutrition support and hear God's Word.

People connected to King Street Church sponsor 95 children in Arcahaie. This support is vital for the school there and for families to have sustainability in these difficult times. At points during the past year the gang violence has caused disruption in most aspects of life in Haiti including the banking system. There were several months when we could not transfer funds but I am glad to say those problems seem to be resolved and we were able to send the full support even though several months of it arrived a bit late.

Please continue to pray for Haiti. We are glad that we are able to do the work of sustaining people through this crisis but it has been almost impossible to get to the community development work that we feel called to do. Over the past years, health crises and kidnappings have had an impact on several local churches. We are grateful for the Canadian and UB churches as they have supported the superintendent after his recent stroke.

Below is the update our coordinator (who is also the translator for the UBIC churches) sent on October 24:

After beginning this report in October, I am sad to say that the situation in Arcahaie has deteriorated.

Michel reported that on October 17, gangs attacked in Arcahaie in an attempt to expand their territory. As of today (October 24), the Police and citizens in Arcahaie have been able to hold them off but school had to close. We hope that it will be safe enough to re-open soon.



Thanks again for your continued support. Jesus tells us that when you reach out to help any of these children you are serving Him. Please keep praying

for Haiti, and the UBIC churches in Haiti who are reaching out in Jesus' name and for these communities.

Prayer Points for The Send

It's officially the month of The Send! I am helping to coordinate the outreach teams. On November 23 (for the actual gathering) I will

be heading up a team of volunteers who are helping with registration, ticket scanning, pretty much just getting everyone into the venue! I leave Kentucky on November 15 to head to LA and then fly out to New Zealand the next day.

Here are a few prayer points from our team:

- **Hunger for God:** We are praying today for an increase in spiritual hunger for the Lord to grip the Church of Aotearoa, New Zealand. God promises in His Word that those who hunger and thirst for righteousness will be satisfied-- with God Himself. Pray that God would direct the affections of our hearts into the Love of God (2 Thess. 3:5), that we would truly taste and see that He is good (Psalm 34:8) and be deeply satisfied in Him (Psalm 36:8-9)!
- **Pastors and Leaders:** Pray for pastors and leaders across NZ to be strengthened and refreshed by the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 3:16). Pray specifically for your pastors and their families, by name! Let's hold up their arms in intercession, thanking the Lord for their sacrificial yes to Him. May God cover them like He promises in Psalm 91, and increase their effectiveness!
- **Jesus Over NZ:** Pray for the gangs of New Zealand, that every member would be saved and sent into the harvest! We are believing for profound encounters with God in every chapter, as well as in the families they represent. Would Jesus receive His reward through their lives!
- **Gospel Movement in the Youth:** Continue praying with us for a mass activation of young people across NZ -- ones who will view their intermediate and high school campuses as their mission field! Pray for

unction to grip their hearts, that they would be filled with faith to pray for a move of God to sweep their schools and would preach the Gospel with boldness and power! Let's pray Acts 4:29-30 over the youth, that God would grant them boldness to speak His Word and that He would stretch out His Hand to heal, performing signs and wonders in the Name of Jesus.

Ministry in Kentucky

One of the joys of this year for me is being a grad assistant with Asbury University's Outreach Coalition! There is a group of four of us who are seminary students who work together to plan and organize one service opportunity each month for the university students to participate in. October's service opportunity was serving a local ministry in Lexington that does a church service and serves a meal to the homeless in the city.

We had about 11 students who volunteered to help out and they did such a great job! A few of them led worship, one of them shared a testimony, and they all helped serve food and spent time talking with some of the people who came. It's so sweet to be able to get to know some of these students and serve alongside of them. One of our dreams for next semester is to begin to build a student leadership team who will really take ownership of encouraging other students to

get involved with local outreach! Please pray that God will bring us students who are passionate about serving others and who have a heart to lead others on campus in serving!

Our outreach event for November is making cards for the veterans who live at the veteran's center here in Wilmore, as well as helping with the Wilmore Veteran's Day Parade :)

Another local project I had the privilege of helping with was Kingdom Conference. This is an annual event at the seminary where we emphasize the transformation of communities

through missions and peacemaking throughout the world. We celebrate the presence of God's Kingdom in our community and in connection with the global Church through our chapel services and special evening events. We helped with the planning and facilitation of all of the events throughout the week. The final event of the conference is an international potluck night where everyone brings dishes from their countries and are encouraged to come wearing cultural clothes. It was a great excuse for me to

break out an old island dress from my days in Vanuatu!
