### Our Journey

#### *A Work of the Spirit*

Since May 2023, King Street Church has been asking God to send a new senior pastor to walk alongside us in discipleship and service.

In August 2023, we met every Thursday to pray as part of our 40 Days of Prayer & Fasting. During this critical step we humbled ourselves in confession, united before God in obedience, admitted our desperate need for the Lord, and yielded our personal opinions.

On November 7, 2023, our senior pastor listing went live with Chemistry Staffing, and the practical portion of the search began.

Then we waited. *And waited.* It wasn't easy.

On Sunday, February 2, we announced the good news: Rev. Dr. Aaron Perry has accepted the position of Senior Pastor here at King Street Church.

Chemistry Staffing had already vetted Pastor Aaron and interviewed him before he was presented as an option. After our leadership reviewed his packet, they met him for an interview via Zoom. Then Pastor Aaron came to Chambersburg to meet with our pastoral team, Personnel Relations Commission, Board of Administration, and Elders.

The Lord was moving in the hearts of our decision-makers throughout Pastor Aaron's visit. When the Board met to discuss their thoughts about him -- although they were aware that another quality candidate was available for consideration -- they made the unanimous decision to extend an offer.

"I am very excited for King Street Church in the calling of Aaron Perry as the next Senior Pastor. From the first reading of his profile and throughout the interview process, I kept thinking how Aaron could really help us. Pastor Aaron is currently the director of Wesleyan Academic Initiatives for The Wesleyan Church, and interim pastor at Sweetser Wesleyan Church. His previous roles include seven years as Associate Professor of Pastoral Theology and Leadership at Wesleyan Seminary at Indiana Wesleyan University.

He has also pastored in local churches for more than a dozen years, where he gained experience ranging from Pastor of Discipleship to Lead Pastor. He has shared an



affection for God's people: "I love God and I love the local church."

Pastor Aaron is a published author of several books, articles, and reviews. A few of the titles include: **Kairos Care: A Process for Pastoral Counseling in the Office and in Everyday Encounters** and **Lay Leadership: For the Care of Souls**. Both his studies and his subsequent professional pursuits show a passion for organization, leadership and discipleship within the body of Christ.

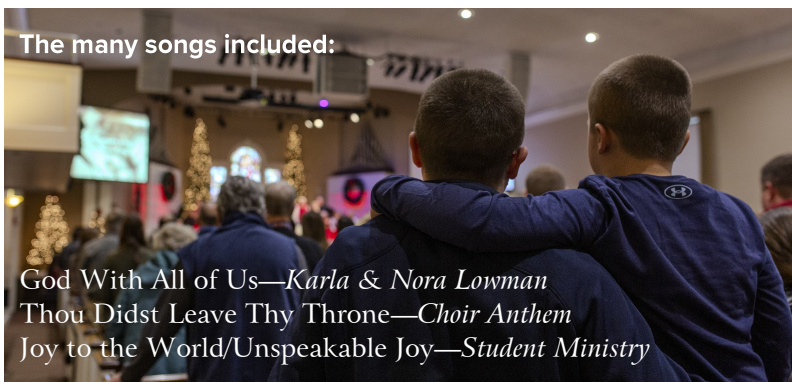

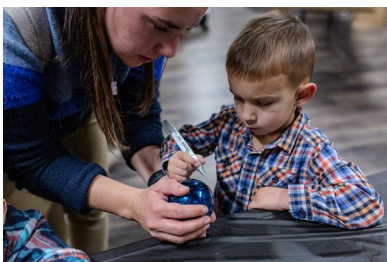
Join us in celebrating God's faithfulness to us in answering our prayers! Let us also thank Him for preserving our church family and God's ministry here in over 18 months of waiting.

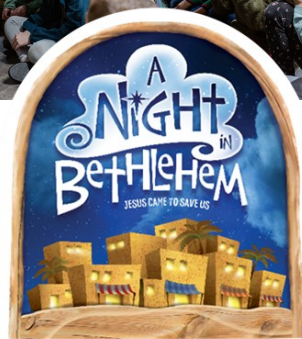
## HOLIDAY HIGH POINTS

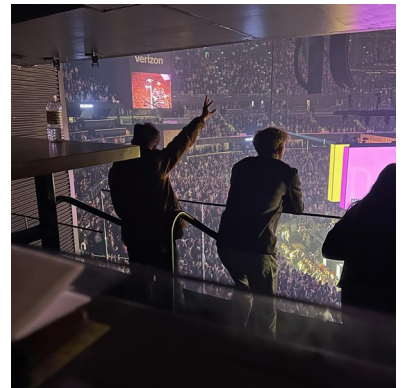

### CHRISTMAS EVE OFFERING UPDATE: \$20,562.04 Received!

This year, we invested our Christmas Eve offering to spread the love of Jesus to adult orphans in Russia and

Kazakhstan through **Orphan's Tree Ministry**, Orphan's Tree ministers to teens and young adults who have grown up in a state orphanage and have "graduated" to independent life without much guidance or support. Our own Pastor John Smith, leader of the Russia Barnabas Team, serves with Orphan's Tree.

Up until now Orphan's Tree centers have been located solely in Russia, but now through God's hand there is an opportunity for the ministry to expand into Kazakhstan, a neighboring country. "Kaz" has a large population of orphan grads but not much organized outreach to them.

Our Christmas Eve gift will help Orphan's Tree plant new ministry in Kazakhstan in 2025. Already through new efforts, these vulnerable young people are being encouraged and learning how to cope and thrive in their new lives. Through the relationships that develop, the hope of the Gospel is shared with the grads by the OT staff.

The offering will help OT establish a physical presence in Almaty, Kazakhstan's capital, and supply much needed resources to begin providing the grads with the aid that Orphan's Tree is experienced in providing.

Thank you for your generosity in reaching orphaned young adults in a far-off place with the hope and tangible love of the Gospel! Thank you!

The mood was simply... joy. Every gift, every morsel of food, every special activity

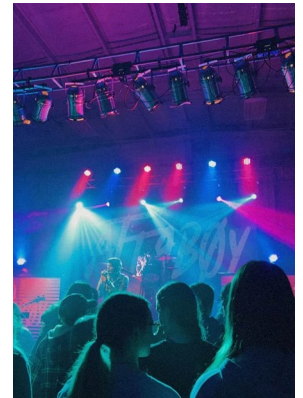

It was a weekend full of friends, food, crazy games, a concert, and time for growing closer to Jesus. The students had the option to ski and snowboard at Seven Springs Resort, or hike at Ohiopyle State Park. We were blessed to have several parents on the trip as leaders. This year eight churches participated, and 87 students went from King Street.

## God's Faithfulness: The Future of RESET

On Wednesday, January 15, a group of dedicated believers met in a classroom below the Baker Center. They prayed together, shared the emotions of grief with one another, and then they got down to work.

Our RESET volunteers, our group facilitators and leaders-- they met and planned for the future of a ministry that has changed their lives.

When the Board announced on Sunday, January 12, that Pastor Adam Keath had been laid off, it was unclear if RESET would continue. But church leadership assured the team: if volunteers wanted to carry on, the church would support them.

At least four of the RESET leaders have been with the ministry since it launched as Celebrate Recovery on Monday, October 1, 2018. In those first days of healing and recovery ministry at King Street, our focus was to provide a space for anyone dealing with a "hurt, habit, or hang-up."

There were a few ironclad values: we would provide a safe, confidential space to be honest about our struggles, we would turn to God for transformation and healing, and we would build a culture of relying on the body of Christ – our community – for accountability and encouragement.

James 5:16 was an oft-quoted verse in those early days: "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed."

The vision was to develop an environment without pretending – as can be the temptation at church – a space where we openly share our

burdens, traumas, and areas of weakness. It was a step away from our culture, where we present only our very best, shining selves.

On a regular basis, we offer the community a chance to claim a "God Tag," a token to remind them of a fruit of the Spirit that God is building in their lives. On those nights, the words of our RESET family speak for themselves – the Lord is changing lives!

After COVID, we changed our name to RESET, in part to minister to a broader church body. Jesus tells us in John 10:10 that, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come that they may have life and have it to the full." Anything that stood in the way of abundant life was the next mountain to tackle.

Around this time the snacks we offered grew to a light dinner, and people regularly gathered before RESET to share in food and fellowship.

Most recently, Pastor Adam was seeking to increase spiritual practices and guided prayer during our worship time, to minister to those seeking deeper relationship with Jesus. He wanted to continue to expand our reach to all people-- those within the church walls and others from our local community. Creating a bridge between church and non-church people has always been a focus.

Pastor Adam envisioned a healing and recovery ministry, and he led it. He preached hundreds of messages, conducted spiritual practices, shared contemplative prayer, invited us into communion, met one-on-one with participants for counseling, and he taught. He taught the community to receive God's grace, and taught an inexperienced group of leaders how to love more deeply, listen without judgment, recognize the marginalized, and enter into the

messiness of life with one another. It was never a one-man show. Pastor Adam trained others to stand on the stage and help carry the load.

And now, the moment has come to take off the training wheels.

The loss of Pastor Adam is one felt keenly by the RESET team, but it will not stop them from carrying on in ministry. Their response is one of being overwhelmingly committed to a community that has become their family. They are a team that has experienced the faithfulness of God, and desires to be a conduit of it. Today we ask for you help in just a few ways.

## PRAYER

We ask that you partner with us in prayer in the weeks and months ahead. Here are some immediate concerns:

- Pray for the Holy Spirit's direction every Monday and that leaders would be sensitive to that leading
- Pray for wisdom as church leaders seek to assign a pastor to the role of providing oversight to the ministry
- Pray for our volunteer leaders to stay strong and not burn out
- Pray that our community would not dwindle during this time of transition
- Pray the Lord's presence would be evident and that God will continue to transform lives

## SUPPORT US

We invite our congregation to join us on a Monday night, and show your support for God's work at RESET. We meet at 6:30 pm in the Student Ministry Center for 30 minutes of prayer, worship, testimonies, and a devotional.

After that, support groups meet. Every week we offer a men's group and a women's group for all issues and concerns. While those who attend the groups may be of different ages, backgrounds, and dealing with different struggles, we have found that a rare closeness has grown around the time of confidential sharing. It's been amazing to see how often participants will experience the same emotions and challenges. Some other groups include:

- **Parents Group** (meets bi-weekly): This group specifically includes parents of grown children who have strayed from the Lord. If you'd like to know more, reach out to Rose and Harvey Zook, or email Susanna Allen at [sallen@kschurch.org](mailto:sallen@kschurch.org).

- **GriefShare:** If you've lost a spouse, child, family member, or friend, you've probably found there are not many people who understand the deep hurt you feel. GriefShare groups meet weekly to help you face these challenges and move toward rebuilding your life. The spring session began meeting on February 3, but lessons are independent of each other and it is ok to join at any time.

RESET has taken a blow. Pray that God's ministry to the broken, to the depressed, to those with addictions, and those just seeking a deeper walk with Jesus – does not falter. Join us in celebrating the work and dedication of Pastor Adam Keath. And let us trust our faithful God together, believing Isaiah 41:10 as one: “Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.”

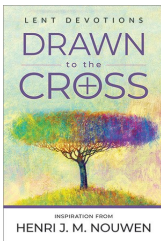
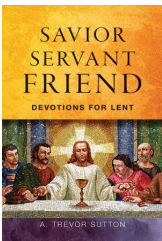

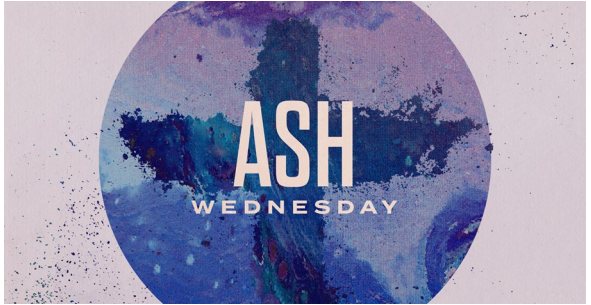

### Lent Devotionals

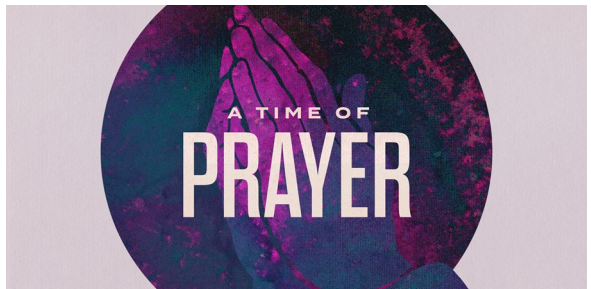
We are again offering Lenten devotionals to use over the 40 days

### Once More Ministries Update

Our OMM ministry shares the love of Jesus and builds relationships by providing toiletries to those in need in our community. We collect toiletry donations year-round and hand them out at quarterly distributions.

At our December 14 distribution, 300 packages each of food and toiletries were provided to 300 families (serving 1,155 people from areas in our own Franklin County as well as neighboring Cumberland County and even as far away as Florida). While our goal is to remain open until noon, our supplies were completely exhausted by 10:50 am! This demonstrates that need continues to be great, and your donations are still crucial and bless our community immensely!

We are thankful to all who participated, including our food partner ministry, Maranatha, and those who donated, helped with preparation, and volunteered on and after Distribution Day. We have an incredible team of selfless volunteers who are dedicated to loving and serving our community, and we are blessed to work alongside them! Our ministry exists not only to meet physical needs but, most importantly, to be the hands and feet of Christ in our community!

#### Christmas Blessings:

- We were blessed to receive a Christmas card from one of our OMM friends who was thankful, noting that they have dealt with several health crises and that the “things you give me help a ton.” Our hope is that, by touching people’s lives via their physical needs, we can also bless them spiritually with the Gospel of Christ!

- The Lord blessed OMM with an unexpected Christmas gift! After submitting our distribution expenses, it was discovered that we were \$349.43 over our annual budget. Much to our surprise (and with literal tears of joy), we learned that a supporter (who is anonymous to us) donated \$350 to OMM via church offering! This is just one of likely many stories of someone following the prompting of the Holy Spirit to support OMM’s mission.

We hope these stories serve to encourage you in serving the Lord in whatever capacity He has for you. We don’t always see how our pieces of the puzzle fit into His big picture, but piece by piece, He uses each contribution to accomplish His plans. YOU are a part of that plan! YOUR work is crucial to the mission!

As part of our Christmas distribution and because of the KSC congregation’s overwhelming generosity, we were thankful to be able to include one of these small nativities for each of our families. We were blessed to see the joy on people’s faces as they expressed their thanks for this small gift! Thank the Lord and YOU for blessing us so we could bless others!

#### Over 6,500 Believers Gathered at The Send!

Almost one month ago, people from all across New Zealand gathered for The Send NZ– and what an incredible day it was! God moved powerfully and so many people were impacted. Over 400 different church communities around NZ were represented that day among the 6,500 people who attended, and an additional 25,000 tuned in on the livestream.

It was honestly so amazing to witness the level of hunger, zeal, and faith throughout the day as thousands of Kiwis encountered God in such tangible ways and caught a heart for missions– completely ready to go wherever and do whatever the Lord leads.

I'm a recent addition in the long line of people who have been believing & praying for a move of God in New Zealand, but it's been almost ten years since I first set foot there. Almost ten years of praying, believing, and serving this nation and to witness November 23 brought me to tears at so many points during the day, realizing we were seeing the beginning of a new era of missions in and from New Zealand.



### Commitments to Take Action

The Send exists to mobilize and activate a generation into their missional and evangelistic calling, so the success of any event our team does is really what happens in the weeks, months, and years following the event.

At The Send events in 2024, our team saw:

- 17,700 Kiwis gather in person across 32 Send events throughout New Zealand and another 32,000 Kiwis tuned in online
- 3,485 individuals 'Take Action' to reach real mission fields
- 914 committed to reaching their High School and 650 committed to reaching their University/Tertiary Campus
- 2,707 committed to reaching their Local Community
- 1,580 Committed to Serving Children in NZ and abroad
- 1,691 Committed to reaching Nations - to be trained and sent in international missions
- 3,144 committed to a Bible reading plan
- 3,162 committed to Prayer for our nation
- 217 Kiwis committed their lives to Jesus for the first time at Send events (130 of these were November 23).

Even just reading down through that list again I have tears in my eyes because these commitments aren't just numbers; each one is a real person who felt a nudge from the Lord and they were obedient and said yes to Him!



Every single person who responded was followed up with by their own local church or one of the organizations that The Send is partnering with. This way people are equipped and encouraged to follow through and keep up with their commitment! Our prayer is that each and every commitment would lead to a lifestyle of action and engagement that brings lasting change to NZ and the nations!

### Looking to 2025 and Beyond

The Lord has moved in some monumental ways throughout this first year of mobilization in NZ. There is so much hunger, faith, and momentum across the nation and the team feels like God is leading us to keep going as we look to the coming years! There are plans for smaller regional gatherings & trainings next year and more large scale gatherings in 2026, but more info on all of that to come.

Personally, my time in New Zealand was so significant. God is reawakening some old hopes and dreams that I buried out of disappointment. I've always known that my involvement with New Zealand is far from over, but now I'm really taking some time to pray and discern from the Lord how He's leading me in the coming year. I know for sure I will continue working with The Send, helping with a variety

of admin, communications, and operational tasks and however else I'm needed. It really is such a joy & gift for me to still be serving this nation. Be encouraged, God really is moving all across the earth!

All of my work with The Send is completely volunteer; no one on our team receives a salary. Everything we do is made possible by individuals and churches who believe in us and invest financially in what we're doing! I have been so blessed over the past ten years by countless people who support me— thank you!

One final update for the year is that I released my first album, "abide," on my 28th birthday which was on December 13th!

### Roger Update

*Be not dismayed, for I am your God.*

Roger had basically been in maintaining mode but we could see signs of his illness slowly advancing. We noted that he had been needing more oxygen little by little. But, in the middle of the pulmonary fibrosis, his pain remained the same which prevented him from trying to leave the house.

He was maneuvering around the house in a scooter. This past Monday things took a big turn for the worse and he has been limited to being in bed. On Monday and Tuesday, a series of difficult things happened to him to tire him out. Since then, just sitting up in bed has caused him to gasp for breath for a period of time, even with the maximum amount of oxygen. He became anxious and depressed.

Yesterday, the Hospice nurse came and gave him an additional medication and has greatly improved. He woke up this morning and said, "For the first time this week I feel that I might keep on living". Praise God!



Many people ask me how I am doing. Being a caregiver can be challenging, and having a network of caring individuals makes all the difference. I have a great supportive family—3 daughters and two grown grandchildren live close by. Hospice is wonderful and they have been very supportive. Many people, like you, have let us know that they are not only praying for Roger but for me also.

As I think of Roger's illness advancing, I feel apprehensive that I be the caregiver he needs—that I remain calm. This morning talking to the Lord he gave me this verse to hold on to—a very well-known one but now mine:

*"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand"* Isaiah 41:10
